

KS1 History Quiz - Olympic Games (Questions)

This quiz addresses the requirements of the National Curriculum KS1 History for children aged 5, 6 and 7 in years 1 and 2. Specifically this quiz is aimed at the section dealing with studying significant events which are commemorated through festivals or anniversaries.

Studying major events which have been commemorated historically in festivals, anniversaries and the like, is an interesting way to notice how things change over time. The Olympic Games is an event which has taken place, with some regularity, for many years and has endured as a festival which celebrates human achievement and athleticism.
