

KS1 Spelling Quiz - Year 1 - The End Sound ck (Questions)

The End Sound ck helps KS1 children learn spellings that end in 'ck'. The spelling rule is outlined in the National Curriculum and states that Year 1 children should know when to add this digraph.

If a word ends in a 'k' sound, it is most likely going to end with a 'ck'. Normally, if the vowel sound before it is short, like an 'eh' sound, the next letters will be 'ck'. Test your knowledge on these spellings.

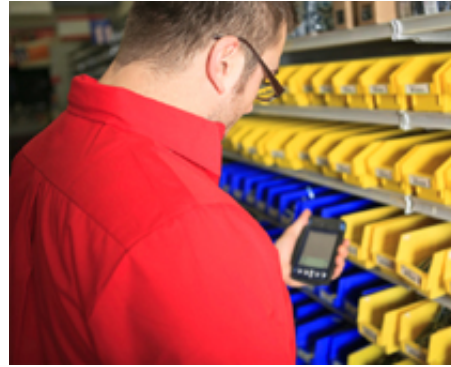
