

KS3 English Quiz - Onomatopoeia 02 (Questions)

Onomatopoeic words sound like their meanings. An example is the whooshing wind because the wind sometimes makes a sound like "whoooooosh"!

Do you want to make your writing really atmospheric? Some well-chosen onomatopoeia might be just what your writing needs. Perhaps for suspense you need a little "crackle", or maybe for a bit of a shock, you might need a "shriek"! A "splat" is always good for comedy, a "dribble" for pathos or disgust, and an "ooze" can be downright horrifying.

Try not to always choose the well-worn words like "crash", "smash", "whistling" and "babbling". See if you can collect interesting examples of onomatopoeia to use in your writing and try to be aware of the different qualities each of these words has so that you can express exactly the sound you want in order to achieve the effect you're aiming for.

1. Find the onomatopoeic word(s) in the following sentence.

The tennis ball over the net.

- hit
- was
- went
- zoomed

"Zoomed" sounds like the very fast action of the ball

2. Find the onomatopoeic word(s) in the following sentence.

The player the ball across the tennis court.

- hit
- pushed
- put
- whacked

"Whacked" tells us that the player hit the ball hard

3. Find the onomatopoeic word(s) in the following sentence.

The tennis ball past the spectators' heads.

- journeyed
- travelled
- went
- whizzed

"Whizzed" is the sound the ball makes as it travels through the air

4. Find the onomatopoeic word(s) in the following sentence.

The fireworks and high up in the sky.

- lit up, died
- screeched, crackled
- travelled, disappeared
- went up, stopped

"Screech" and "crackle" express two very different sounds fireworks make

5. Find the onomatopoeic word(s) in the following sentence.

The people watching the display and.....

- arrived, left
- came, went
- come, go
- roared, cheered

The "roars" and "cheers" are the sounds of the crowd

6. Find the onomatopoeic word(s) in the following sentence.

The children sang " black sheep".

- baa baa
- moo moo
- quack quack
- woof woof

Nursery rhymes often use onomatopoeia, as in "ding dong bell"

7. Find the onomatopoeic word(s) in the following sentence.

Voice 1: "....." Voice 2: "Who's there?"

- hello hello
- knock knock
- rap rap
- tap tap

Voice 1: "Dr!" Voice 2: "Dr Who?" Jokes use onomatopoeia too!

- was on

Watery onomatopoeic words include "drip", "glug" and "splash"

Onomatopoeia for cooking includes "burst", "crackled" and "spit"

10. Find the onomatopoeic word(s) in the following sentence.

"Blared" and "blazed" are other possibilities here
